5-6-3: FEES:

The applicant for a license under this chapter shall pay to the City Clerk, at the time of filing an application, the following nonrefundable license fee. A gaming terminal's per machine annual fee will be based on the location's share of the net terminal income for the preceding calendar year ending December 31. Video gaming establishments that are applying for an initial license will be charged \$100 per machine terminal for the initial license year with the exception of fraternal organizations or public tax-exempt organizations who will be charged \$25 per machine. Video gaming terminal operators will be charged the same per terminal fees as the combined fees for video gaming establishments linked to each respective operator.
