AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF PEORIA LIMITING THE NUMBER OF SITE APPROVALS OF ESTABLISHMENTS WHOSE PRIMARY PURPOSE IS TO OPERATE AS A VIDEO GAMBLING CAFÉ

WHEREAS, the City of Peoria is a home rule unit of government pursuant to Article VII, Section 6 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois 1970, and may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs, including regulating and licensing the retail sale of alcoholic liquors;

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois passed the Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/1 *et. seq.*, permitting limited use of video gaming machines at particular premises that are licensed to serve alcoholic beverages within the State; and

WHEREAS, the Video Gaming Act contains no specific statutory prohibition to a home-rule unit of government from regulating and licensing the retail sale and service of alcoholic beverages;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Peoria finds that it has an interest in protecting its citizens from the proliferation of establishments that desire liquor site approvals and licenses for the primary purpose to operate as a video gambling café; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PEORIA, ILLINOIS, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: Chapter 3 of the Code of the City of Peoria is hereby amended by deleting the following stricken words and by adding the following underlined words.

Sec. 3-52. Classes.

Licensee to sell alcoholic liquor at retail are hereby divided into classes as follows:

(3)Class G. Class "G-A" licenses shall authorize the retail sale of beer and wine only and for on-site consumption of any tavern; "G-B" licenses for the retail sale of beer and wine only and for on-site consumption of any restaurant, or "G-C" licenses for the retail sale of beer and fine wine only on the premises of any gift or flower shop with no on-site consumption and no more than 15% of the gross revenue in any month from the operation of the establishment be from the retail sale of beer and wine. The annual fee for such licenses shall be \$840.00. Class "G-V" licenses shall authorize the retail sale of beer and wine only and for on-site consumption of any establishment whose primary purpose is to operate as a video gambling café or whose estimated net revenue from the sale of food, alcohol, and/or general merchandise is less than 51% in any given month from the operation of the licensed premises. Any establishment with a "G-V" license must have its employee pour and serve alcoholic beverages into a glass or plastic container for on-site consumption for its patrons. The annual fee for such licenses shall be \$10,000.00.

Section 3-101. Restrictions on site approval for the retail sale of alcoholic liquors.

(1) Within the corporate boundaries of the City of Peoria Commencing at the intersections of the extended centerline of Fayette Street and the Illinois River; thence up Fayette Street, as extended, along its centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Perry Avenue; thence southwesterly along the centerline of Perr Avenue to its intersection with the centerline of William Kumpf Boulevard; thence down the centerline of Jefferson Street ending at the intersection of South Street, to include properties on both sides of South Street; thence southeasterly along South Street as extended to its intersection with the Illinois River and thence up the Illinois River to the point of commencement.
