31 vacant positions that will be eliminated as part of the 2020-2021 budget process. 23 of these positions were budgeted, and 8 police vacancies were unbudgeted. 12 positions have taken, or will be taking, the Early Retirement Incentive or the Voluntary Separation Initiative that will not be filled. 4 positions were reassigned due to federal grant funding (a Management Analyst and Code Inspector) or the lighting project funding (2 Electricians). 6 positions were reduced due to layoff (Chief Innovation Officer, I/S Project Leader, Accountant, Project Coordinator, and 2 Laborers). The Chief Information Officer will be added back into the budget for 2021.

The City has submitted \$124,500 in payroll overtime expenses for COVID-19 to FEMA and \$422,642.01 in additional expenses. These would be eligible for 75% reimbursement. The remaining 25% of these costs, coupled with any FEMA-rejected expenses would be submitted to IL DCEO for reimbursement under the CURE Program. The detailed breakdown of the \$422,642.01 is below:

The City is eligible under the Illinois CURES program for reimbursement up to \$4,744,387. Public safety salary expenses have been added by the US Treasury as an eligible reimbursement. The City anticipates receiving the full reimbursement from DCEO of \$4,744,387.
