### **ORDINANCE NO. 17,145**

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF PEORIA FOR A TEMPORARY MORATORIUM OF SITE APPROVAL OF ESTABLISHMENTS WHOSE PRIMARY PURPOSE IS TO OPERATE AS A VIDEO GAMBLING CAFÉ

WHEREAS, the City of Peoria is a home rule unit of government pursuant to Article VII, Section 6 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois 1970, and may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs, including regulating and licensing the retail sale of alcoholic liquors;

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois passed the Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/1 et. seq., permitting limited use of video gaming machines at particular premises that are licensed to serve alcoholic beverages within the State; and

WHEREAS, the Video Gaming Act contains no specific statutory prohibition to a home-rule unit of government from regulating and licensing the retail sale and service of alcoholic beverages;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Peoria finds that it has an interest in protecting its citizens from the proliferation of establishments that desire liquor site approvals and licenses for the primary purpose of operating as a video gambling café; and:

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PEORIA, ILLINOIS, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> Chapter 3 of the Code of the City of Peoria is hereby amended by deleting the following stricken words and by adding the following underlined words:

#### Section 3-1. Definitions.

<u>Video gaming café is an establishment or a business whose primary purpose is to operate video gaming terminals as defined under the Illinois Video Gaming Act and in which the sale of pre-packaged foods or snacks and alcoholic beverages are only incidental to the operation of the video gaming terminals.</u>

# Section 3-101. Restrictions on site approval for the retail sale of alcoholic liquors.

- (a) Subject to the provisions of Section 3-100(c), no additional site application for Class "A" or "B-1G-A" retail sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption on or off the premises of an establishment whose primary purpose is to operate video gaming terminals as defined under the Illinois Video Gaming Act and holds itself out to the public as a video gaming café, shall be approved within the following described territory or district:
  - (1) <u>Within the corporate boundaries of the City of Peoria Commencing</u> at the intersections of the extended centerline of Fayette Street and the Illinois River; thence up Fayette Street, as extended, along its centerline

to its intersection with the centerline of Perry Avenue; thence southwesterly along the centerline of Perry Avenue to its intersection with the centerline of William Kumpf Boulevard; thence down the centerline of William Kumpf Boulevard, as extended, to its intersection with Jefferson Street, then southwesterly along the centerline of Jefferson Street ending at the intersection of South Street, to include properties on both sides of South Street; thence southeasterly along South Street as extended to its intersection with the Illinois River and thence up the Illinois River to the point of commencement.

(2) This restriction shall expire on <u>March 1, 2015</u> January 1, 2014 unless extended by the City Council.

<u>Section 2.</u> This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon after its passage.
