

Trewyn Park, originally named South Park, is one of the first 5 parks in the Peoria Park District system. This neighborhood park is 10 acres in size, and featured the District's first play structure. In 1913, the pavilion that currently stands was built.

Trewyn Park's mature tree stand, grand boulevard and stately pavilion lend to a beauty that is not found in newer neighborhood parks. These unique features, in addition to a wide variation of topography and pathways help to shape how the park can evolve over time.

With that in mind, the Park District is looking to make several improvements to Trewyn Park. These include the addition of a new playground, two new basketball hoops, as well as a shelter. While the shelter will be entirely new to the park, the playground and basketball hoops will replace existing in different locations.
