## Violence...A Public Health Crisis

- Violence is an urgent public health problem. From infants to the elderly, it affects people in all stages of life and can lead to a lifetime of physical, emotional, and economic problems.
- The focus of public health is on the well being, safety, and overall health of entire populations. A unique aspect of the approach is that it strives to provide the maximum benefit for the largest number of people.
- Public health draws on a science base that is multi-disciplinary. It relies on knowledge from a broad range of disciplines including medicine, epidemiology, sociology, psychology, criminology, education, and economics. This broad knowledge base has allowed the field of public health to respond successfully to a range of health conditions globally.
- The public health approach also emphasizes input from diverse sectors including health, education, social services, justice, policy, and the private sector. Collective action on the part of these stakeholders can help in addressing problems like violence.

### The Center for Disease Control and Violence...

Public Health Agencies can play an important and unique role in preventing youth violence. Public health agencies typically place prevention at the forefront of efforts and work to create broad population-level impact, can bring *critical* leadership and resources to bear on this problem.

### Public Health Agencies:

- ✓ Can bring together partners and stakeholders to plan, prioritize, and coordinate youth violence prevention activities.
- ✓ Well positioned to collect and disseminate data, implement preventive measures, evaluate programs and policies, and track progress.

# The Cycle of Abuse Tension Builds Abusive Incident Honeymoon Phase

#### Tension Builds

Stress begins to grow from the pressures of daily life, or other points of conflict. The victim may attempt to reduce tension by complying with the abuser.

#### Abusive Incident

Verbal, emotional, physical, or sexual abuse occurs. This includes anger, intimidation, threats, and other forms of abuse.

#### Honeymoon Phase

The abuser apologizes, shows remorse. and often begs for forgiveness. They may shower the victim with love and affection, and promise that the abuse will never happen again.

#### **Calm**

The relationship enters a period of calm where the abuse stops or slows. The abuser may continue to ask for forgiveness, or make positive gestures, but these tend to reduce in sincerity over time.

### Effects of Violence on Youth

Children who experience violence have several health conditions and risk behaviors, including:

- Truancy due to safety concerns
- Risky sexual behavior
- Low academic grades
- Overweight or obesity
- Carried a weapon (gun/knife)
- Felt sad or hopeless
- Suicidal thoughts or behavior
- Substance use/abuse

If this sounds familiar to you then you or someone you know has more than likely experienced some form of trauma from violence.

#### **School Based Collaboration**

- Maintaining a presence in the schools is important.
- Resources are available within the school and for many youth a safe place.
- Collaborate with existing interdisciplinary team that can help address social challenges youth face.

### **Mentoring Programs**

- Engage mentoring programs that have been successful in that community.
- Provide variety in activity options with the ability for children to be "children".
- Develop custom approaches to working with identified atrisk youth.

### **Community Empowerment**

- Creating Protective Community Environments by strategically partnering with other agencies.
- Inclusion of support services
   (i.e. Law Enforcement,
   public health, neighborhood
   groups) when implementing a
   comprehensive safety plan
   and access to more resources
   for residents.

- Reductions in victimization and perpetration of violence
- Reductions in nonviolent and violent criminal behavior
- Reductions in arrests and recidivism
- Reductions in gang involvement
- Reductions in out-of-home placements
- Reductions in child abuse
- Reductions in substance use
- Reductions in symptoms of PTSD, depression, and behavioral problems
- Increases in school attendance and homework completion
- Increases in positive parenting and family management practices (e.g., monitoring and supervision)
- Improvements in family relationships and communication

### Intervene to Lessen Harm

- ✓ Utilizing programs such as **Safe Passage** provides students safe routes to and from school by placing *highly visible* community members along these routes to monitor and assist with students' safe travel.
- ✓ Community members are hired and their role is to be physically present on routes students usually take to and from school.
- ✓ Safe passage workers are trained on conflict deescalation strategies and have reporting protocols for violent behavior.

- Project Amani will work with the Peoria leadership to change the narrative of these communities.


