Medical Cannabis

- Illinois residents who have qualifying conditions can register with the state in order to obtain cannabis for medical use.
- Physician certification required.
- 52 qualifying conditions are defined.
- Eligible to purchase 2.5 ounces (70 grams) every 14 days.



Medical Cannabis - Statewide

- 235,798 approved applications (1,025 < 18yrs)
- 138,052 active patients
- 55 dispensaries statewide
- 2022 retail sales by medical dispensaries:

<u>\$237,439,693.28</u>

 Total retail sales since Nov. 2015 by medical dispensaries:

\$1,522,615,122.40



Medical Cannabis - Peoria

- Trinity Compassionate Care Center
 - 2,846 registered patients (2021)
 - 2,091 registered patients (2020)
 - 1,220 registered patients (2019)
- Peoria County
 - 1,568 active patients (2021)
 - 1,074 qualifying patients (2020)
 - 811 qualifying patients (2019)



Medical Cannabis - Regulation

- Zoning
 - Special uses in all commercial districts.
 - Permitted uses in industrial district.
 - Prohibited in all other districts, including form districts.
- Business License



Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act

As of January 1, 2020, the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act legalized recreational consumption, possession and sales of cannabis products in Illinois.



Recreational Cannabis

Adults over 21 can possess cannabis for recreational use, subject to the following limits:

	Resident	Non-Resident
Cannabis	30 grams	15 grams
Concentrate	5 grams	2.5 grams
THC	500 mg	250 mg




Recreational Cannabis

Use Allowed


- Private residences
- On-site cannabis businesses*

Use Prohibited

- Public place
- Motor vehicle
- School grounds
- Near someone under 21
- Near on-duty school bus driver, police officer or firefighter
- Any business or landlord can prohibit on private property

Recreational Cannabis - Peoria

- Trinity Compassionate Care Centers

- Special Use Permits Approved (*as of 10/5/22)
 - 5001 N. University NuMed East Peoria, LLC
 - 4600 Brandywine 2018 DT South Beloit, LLC
 - 3929 W. War Memorial Blue Apple Property,
 LLC/World of Weed



- Recreational cannabis allowed.
- Reasonable zoning restrictions.
- On-site consumption reserved.
- Tax imposed.
- Business license required.



- Recreational cannabis allowed:
 - Ordinance No. 17719 (adopted 10/15/19)
 allowed cannabis based businesses to operate within the City:
 - Craft grower
 - Cultivation centers
 - Dispensaries
 - Infusers
 - Processers



- Reasonable zoning restrictions:
 - Minimum distance limitation of 500' to a child care facility, school, youth recreation and churches
 - Permitted use in industrial districts
 - Special uses in all commercial districts
 - Prohibited in all other districts, including form districts



- On-Site Consumption Reserved:
 - Smoke Free Illinois amended to allow on-site consumption if: (1) authorized by the local government; (2) business maintains specially designated area; (3) limited to 21+; and (4) locked door. (410 ILCS 82/35(8))
 - Pending Legislation would allow city to issue temporary event licenses for cannabis clubs and tours (HB 144)



Tax Imposed:

3% tax adopted via ordinance 17,713 on 9/24/19.

Purchase Price (\$100/THC over 35%)	\$100.00
Illinois sales tax (6.25%)	\$6.25
County sales tax (1.0%)	\$1.00
City sales tax (1.75%)	\$1.75
State cannabis tax (25%)	\$25.00
County cannabis tax (3%)	\$3.00
City cannabis tax (3%)	\$3.00
Total cost:	\$140.00



- Business license required:
 - State license required before City will process local license.
 - Fee Schedule
